



Christ Church CofE (VA) Primary School and Nursery School Form for Admission to Nursery 2019/2020

Parents should fill in this form when applying for a place At the school and ensure that they have read a copy of the Admission Policy & Nursery Arrangements documents prior to completing the form.

Christ Church has its origins in the Town School founded in 1860 by Robert Hanbury for the purpose of providing children with a 'spiritual and moral education'. It became a primary school in 1961 and established its present status as a church school in 1971. Its links with the parish church are very good and are evident in the strong Christian ethos of the school.

The ethos' of the school is characterised by a strong sense of caring and mutual respect. It is a feature of school life that creates a very harmonious atmosphere and enables children to feel secure and learn with confidence. A notable aspect of the ethos is the strong sense of inclusiveness and community. All the adults in the school, teaching and non-teaching, work as a team and value each other's contributions.

There is a good climate for learning at Christ Church, due to the strong leadership and good teaching that exists in the school. Children achieve well in all aspects of school life.

The behaviour of the children in and around school is very good. Discipline is well managed by the staff with much praise and endorsement of good behaviour. The school encourages children to understand the need for self-discipline and rules for behaviour. Each class discusses and agrees a set of rules.

The school has excellent links with Christ Church. The vicar and members of his team are frequent visitors to the school. The governing body is strongly committed to the Christian ethos of the school and is very supportive of the staff. This creates a strong sense of common purpose.

Children's spiritual, moral and social development is very good. There are clear expectations of children. They are taught, by word and example, to respect and value each other. The pastoral care provided by all adults in the school is very good. Spiritual development is promoted through the ethos of the school, collective worship and the curriculum. Children are encouraged to reflect, to question and to respond in a wide range of contexts. The school provides opportunities for children to respond to the needs of others, through a range of charitable causes. Children are sensitive to the needs of others.

In conclusion Christ Church is an ever-improving school – our aim is to maintain the best of traditional values, alongside a modern and exciting approach to teaching and learning.

Admissions Criteria

If applications to Christ Church Nursery exceed the number of places available, then the following set of admission criteria, or rules, are used to decide which children to offer places to:

1. Children with a Educational Health Care Plan which names the school will be allocated a place in accordance with section 324 of the Education Act 1996. Children for whom it can be demonstrated that they have a particular medical or social need to go to the school.
2. Children in public care (children looked after).
3. A child 'at risk' (or the sibling of a child 'at risk') who is the subject of an inter-agency child protection plan.
4. All 'looked after' children or children who were previously 'looked after' but immediately after being 'looked after' became subject to an adoption, child arrangement or special guardianship order (see definitions)
5. Children who have a sibling who will be attending the school at the time of entry (see definitions).
6. Children whose families attend a church service at Christ Church, Ware, or St Mary's the Virgin, Ware, at least once a month, for at least a year before the application of places. (Please ask your minister to complete the last page of this for).
7. Children of staff employed by the Governing Body of Christ Church School on a permanent basis: children will be allocated a place if either or both of the following conditions are met: a. Where a member of staff has been employed by the school for two or more years at the time the application is made. b. Where the Governors can demonstrate that the member of staff has been recruited to fill a vacant position for which there is a demonstrable skills shortage. (see definitions).
8. Children who live (home address) within the parishes of St Mary's and Christ Church.
9. Any other children – children in this category will be allocated according to distance; those living closest to the school first.

Right of Appeal: Parents are asked not to telephone the school to discuss the allocation but appeal in writing to the School giving the circumstances to be taken into account.
